<p>Ascension</p> <p><b>Jesus returning to be with God in heaven after the crucifixion</b></p>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- 40 days Jesus ascending to heaven</li> <li>-</li> </ul>	<p>Omnipotent</p> <p><b>God’s nature as all-powerful</b></p>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- God is powerful</li> <li>- <i>“In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth”</i></li> </ul>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- <i>Jonah and the whale – proves Gods power!</i></li> </ul>
<p>Atonement</p> <p><b>Making things better after sinning, asking for forgiveness from God</b></p> <p>Key words to link in when explaining atonement:  <b>Redeemer</b> = someone who pays the price to buy something back, like paying a ransom.  <b>Redemption</b> = being saved from sin.  <b>Saviour</b> = Someone who rescues someone else from danger.  <b>Salvation</b> = saving from sin through faith in Christ.</p>	<p>Original Sin</p> <p><b>The built-in tendency to do wrong which comes from Eve’s disobedience</b></p>  <p><i>“Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour”</i></p>
<p>Benevolent</p> <p><b>God’s nature as all-loving</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- God loves us like a father.</li> </ul> 	<p>Resurrection</p> <p><b>Jesus returning from the dead after he was crucified</b></p>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Remember what happened to Aslan – he was crucified and rose from the dead to ascend to heaven!</li> <li>- This is what Christians believe what happened to Jesus.</li> </ul>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Humans die and the soul is judged from heaven or hell.</li> <li>- Jesus’ body was kept in a tomb. Mary Madelene discovered Jesus had resurrected</li> </ul>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Jesus spoke to the disciples many times in the 40 days before ascension. The last is important</li> <li>- Last = mount olives Jesus said <i>“Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit”</i></li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- After his resurrection Jesus appeared to his disciples and told them to spread the word of him</li> <li>- This event is celebrated on <b>Easter Sunday</b></li> </ul> <p><i>“He is risen”</i> – Christians say this to each other on Easter Sunday</p>
<p>Just</p> <p><b>God’s nature as fair</b></p>	
<p>Monotheism – one God</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Christians believe in <b>one God</b> who is the creator and the sustainer of all that exists.</li> </ul>	
<p>The Problem of Suffering</p> <p>If God is all these things why do they allow bad things to happen to good and innocent people?</p>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Irenaeus</b> does not deny that evil exists in the world.</li> <li>• Irenaeus does not deny God allows evil to exist.</li> <li>• He states evil exists in the world in order to bring about the greater good which is human freedom and a relationship with God.</li> <li>• Evil is part of the process towards becoming more like God</li> </ul> <p><i>“God places the heaviest burdens on those who can carry its weight”</i></p>	
<p>Freewill defence:</p> <p>We have to suffer evil because we have God’s gift of freewill – if we didn’t have freewill, we would be like puppets or robots.</p>	
<p>Crucifixion</p> <p><b>Jesus’ execution by the Romans on the cross.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Jesus travelled to Jerusalem to preach and he was sentenced to death by Pontius Pilate</li> <li>- Jesus was then nailed to a <b>cross</b> where he died.</li> </ul>	<p>Salvation</p> <p><b>Being saved from sin and given eternal life in heaven by God</b></p>

- In his last moments Jesus was able to forgive those who were killing him showing Christians how important **forgiveness** is **“Today you will be with me in paradise”** – this is what Jesus said to the criminal.



- This event is remembered on Good Friday.

**“Forgive them father, they know not what they do”** – Luke 23:34.



- The last supper when Jesus said the bread was his body and wine was his blood is now reacted by Christians to remember.



- **Salvation** is the idea that Jesus’s crucifixion saves human beings from eternal damnation.

A Christian achieve Salvation (saved from sin and granted eternal life in heaven) by doing these 3 things:

1. Following Bible teachings

E.g **“Give to the poor and you will receive treasure in heaven”** and following the teachings of the **Parables**

2. Following the works of Jesus

E.g Role model – forgiving and helping the poor

2. Listening to their conscience

E.g. **“Your body is a temple of the holy spirit”**

Incarnation

## God becoming flesh in the form of Jesus Christ

- Christians believe that God was **incarnated** (born) in human form as **Jesus Christ**.




- **Mary** was impregnated by the Holy Spirit and gave birth as a virgin – for Christians this is proof of Jesus’ status as the son of God.



- **Christmas** is the festival that celebrates the incarnation **“The word became flesh”** – John 1:14

## Any thought or action which goes against God’s will



- Christians believe you are **judged** after you die. God decides if you go to **heaven** or **hell**.

**Parable of the sheep and goats** explains this,

- God gave humans **free will** but they should use that freedom to make good

choices and not sin



The death of Jesus made up for **original sin** – the idea that we were all damned by Eve’s choice to disobey God – it allows us to atone for sins and reach eternal life in heaven

Trinity

Father, Son and Holy Spirit

A central belief for all Christians is the belief in the **Trinity**. Christians believe that **God is one** but exists in three different 'persons'. God the **Father**, the **Son** and the **Holy Spirit**. Christians believe that these **three persons** also form a **unity** whom were all present during the creation of the world and that each person has a different role.

The word Trinity comes from the **prefix 'tri'** meaning **'three'** and **'unity'** meaning **'one'**.


### The Father

This is the part of God that is the **creator** of the world. The giver of life and of law.



### The Son

This is the part of God that was **incarnated** as a human and was the **salvation** of man.



### The Holy Spirit

This is the part of God that is active within the world.
