## GCSE EXTERNALLY SET TASK

**Starting points:** Exam paper released 2<sup>nd</sup> January to OCR website. List of themes/ starting points. Select one to explore. Exam 10 hours will be in April. 40% of overall grade.

Consider if you intend to explore the theme through portraiture/ landscapes or still life.

#### **AO1: Own Photos:**

Take a set of photographs relating to the theme you have selected. For each artist you choose to study, take a set of photographs inspired by the artist to develop your theme. AO3:Record: Copies from own photos. Detailed pencil studies and colour studies from own photos. Always work on good quality paper. Use the simple grid method if you do not have access to a light box.



Simple grid method: divide the image work you want to copy into 4 equal parts. Recreate the Landscape work one section at a time.


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
**AO1: Develop:** Research own artist reference(s).

- 6. What emotions are represented?
- 7. What would you like to know about it?
- 8. What do you like and dislike about it? Why?
- 9. How do you think it may have been achieved?
- 10. What ideas can you take from it, what aspects would you like to use in your own work?
