- In his last moments Jesus was able to forgive those who were killing him showing Christians how important forgiveness is "Today you will be with me in paradise" – this is what Jesus said to the criminal.



- This event is remembered on Good Friday.

"Forgive them father, they know not what they do" – Luke 23:34.



- The last supper when Jesus said the bread was his body and wine was his blood is now reacted by Christians to remember.



- **Salvation** is the idea that Jesus's crucifixion saves human beings from eternal damnation.

A Christian achieve Salvation (saved from sin and granted eternal life in heaven) by doing these 3 things:

1. Following Bible teachings

E.g "Give to the poor and you will receive treasure in heaven" and following the teachings of the Parables

2. Following the works of Jesus
E.g Role model – forgiving and helping the poor

2. Listening to their conscience

E.g. "Your body is a temple of the holy spirit"

Incarnation

God becoming flesh in the form of Jesus Christ

- Christians believe that God was incarnated (born) in human form as Jesus Christ.



- **Mary** was

impregnated by the Holy Spirit and gave birth as a virgin – for Christians this is proof of Jesus' status as the son of God.

- **Christmas** is the festival that celebrates the incarnation *"The word became flesh"* – John 1:14

Sin

Any thought or action which goes against God's will



- Christians believe you are **judged** after you die. God decides if you go to **heaven** or **hell.**

Parable of the sheep and goats explains this,

- God gave humans **free will** but they should use that freedom to make good





The death of Jesus made up for original sin – the idea that we were all damned by Eve's choice to disobey God – it allows us to atone for sins and reach eternal life in heaven

Trinity

Father, Son and Holy Spirit A central belief for all Christians is the belief in the Trinity. Christians believe that God is one but exists in three different 'persons'. God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Christians believe that these three persons also form a unity whom were all present during the creation of the world and that each person has a different role.

The word Trinity comes from the prefix 'tri' meaning 'three' and 'unity' meaning 'one'.


The Father

This is the part of God that is the **creator** of the world. The giver of life and of law.



The Son

This is the part of God that was **incarnated** as a human and was the **salvation** of man.





The Holy Spirit

This is the part of God that is active within the world.
