Snow Days

Despite the school being open, all school buses running, all teaching staff being in school and the snow being really quite minimal (especially by late morning), many students did not make it into school on Monday 6th January. There will be plenty of legitimate personal circumstances meaning that keeping your child off school was absolutely the right choice, and I don't question these decisions made with the safety of your children at heart especially within a rural context. However, can I ask that should we find ourselves in this situation again where there has been snowfall but the school is open, that you send your child into school if you possibly can, or as soon as the snow has melted – I am more than happy for students to come in in dribs and drabs during the day as the snow melts – especially those that can walk to school safely.

Punctuality

Students should arrive to school between 8.30 and 8.40. It is extremely frustrating to us how late our school buses can be and I want to reassure parents that we are raising this dissatisfaction with the bus companies on a regular basis. Please can I ask that students who walk to school or who are driven by car to school are on site in good time so that we can have a prompt start to the school day. Really appreciate your support with this and thank you to those families that already get their children to school on time every day.

Ski trip

The ski trip to Andorra has been hugely successful. Student conduct has been exemplary and staff and students have had a fantastic time. A huge thank you to Mrs Thomas for overseeing the trip, to the staff who contributed to the success of the trip and the students who made the trip such a pleasure.

Parental meetings

There are times when families quite understandably want immediate access to school staff. Schools are really the only remaining public service where people expect to see a member of staff immediately without making an appointment. Please can I ask that to avoid disappointment and frustration, you make an appointment in advance, with the appropriate member of staff before arriving in school expecting to see them on the spot. As in most workplaces, staff appreciate a 'heads up' on the content of an upcoming meeting so that they are well prepared – this also helps to make the meeting more productive for you too.

Our intention is to try and ensure that all parents can attend the evening, but we understand that with the short notice there may be work commitments and exceptional circumstances that sometimes prevent this. 
