GCSE Drama if a fantastic course that can broaden the school experience for students. It can also develop vital communication, teamwork, creative and problems-solving skills so important in working life whilst also enriching their cultural and creative life.

Course Overview:

Component 1 – **Devising** - 30% of the GCSE (coursework)

- As part of a group students devise and perform an original piece of theatre inspired by a stimulus. It is marked individually.
- Individually they produce a portfolio evidencing and evaluating the creation process. This can be a mixture of written recorded evidence.
- The unit can be studied as performer or as a designer potentially focusing on lighting, set, costume or sound design.
- This unit is internally assessed by WBS teachers.

<u>Component 2 – Text in Performance - 30% of the GCSE (coursework)</u>

- Students perform or design two extracts from a published of our choice.
- Students can choose to perform a monologue (speech on their own) a duologue (with a partner) or a group piece.
- We get to choose the plays that students perform.
- The unit can be studied as a performer or designer potentially focusing on lighting, set, costume or sound design.
- This unit is externally assessed by a visiting examiner in the Spring of Year 11.

Component 3 – *Performance & Response (Written Exam)* - 40% of the GCSE

- 1 hour 30-minute exam.
- Section A The study of a set play text chosen by the teacher from a selection provided by the exam board. We study this both practically and in theory. Students answer 8 practical questions.
- Section B An evaluation of a live theatre experience we usually have a theatre visit in each year of the course.

Around this course structure are great opportunities to explore, experiment and develop students' knowledge and experience in Drama.
