## **Physical Education**

#### Edward Shines on the Slopes in a Standout Ski Season

Year 9 student Edward has had a phenomenal year, both on and off the slopes, showcasing extraordinary talent, dedication, and sportsmanship. His hard work has paid off with a string of remarkable achievements that have firmly placed him among the best young skiers in the country—and beyond.

This season, Edward was selected for the British Children's Ski Team and proudly represented Great Britain at several prestigious international competitions. Among his standout performances:

9th place in the world (Slalom) at Alpe Cimbra, known as the Children's World Cup 1st place Giant Slalom in Bankso

2nd place Giant Slalom and Slalom in Pamporovo

- Ist place Slalom at the Lowlands Championships
- Crowned U14 English Giant Slalom Champion
- U14 British Champion in both Slalom and Super G
- Named Overall British U14 Champion

Now competing in the U16 category, Edward has continued his winning streak, already making waves in indoor races at Chill Factore.

A huge congratulations to Edward on an exceptional season—your school is incredibly proud!

To report to the Bridgnorth Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT), you can use their dedicated email address: bridgnorth.snt@westmercia.police.uk. For nonemergency situations, you can also call the 101 non-emergency number or report online at the West Mercia Police website. In emergencies, always call 999.

The Bridgnorth SNT also has a Facebook page, Bridgnorth Police, where you can find updates and sometimes report incidents. However, for reporting crimes or emergencies, the website and phone numbers are the preferred methods.

The SNT is based at Bridgnorth Police Station on Wenlock Road. Their area of operation includes Bridgnorth town and the parishes of Alveley, Claverley, Worfield, and Ackleton. The team also includes officers for Broseley and Much Wenlock

#### Dear WBS Families

Thank you for expressing an interest in the out of area bus for September. We have worked hard to secure an alternative provision and are pleased to inform you that Borland Roadliner Limited will be providing the service for the 2025/2026 academic year.

If your child is in Y7-10 the total cost for the year will be approx. £1100.00 – dependent on numbers and this will need to be paid via Arbor. There will be 1 deposit payment of £50.00; deadline for payment is 01/07/25. This will be followed by 11 monthly instalments. Costs will be finalised once we have confirmed numbers and we for-see the increase equating to a rise of a couple of pounds a week. We recognise the challenges that all families face when outgoings increase but please be assured that we have done our utmost to limit the financial impact as much as we can.

If your child is in Y11 they will only pay 10 monthly instalments - total cost approx.  $\pm 1000.00$  – dependent on numbers. There will be 1 deposit payment for  $\pm 50.00$ , deadline for payment is 01/07/25. This will be followed by 10 monthly instalments. Costs will be finalised once we have confirmed numbers.

We are aware that the price for the Arriva bus was increasing and feel that the above cost is similar to the amount you would have been charged by them had we not ended the contract.

If you are interested in joining a WBS parent-led group whose objectives would be to raise money towards the cost of the bus fare, please email us to let us know so we can coordinate this on your behalf.
