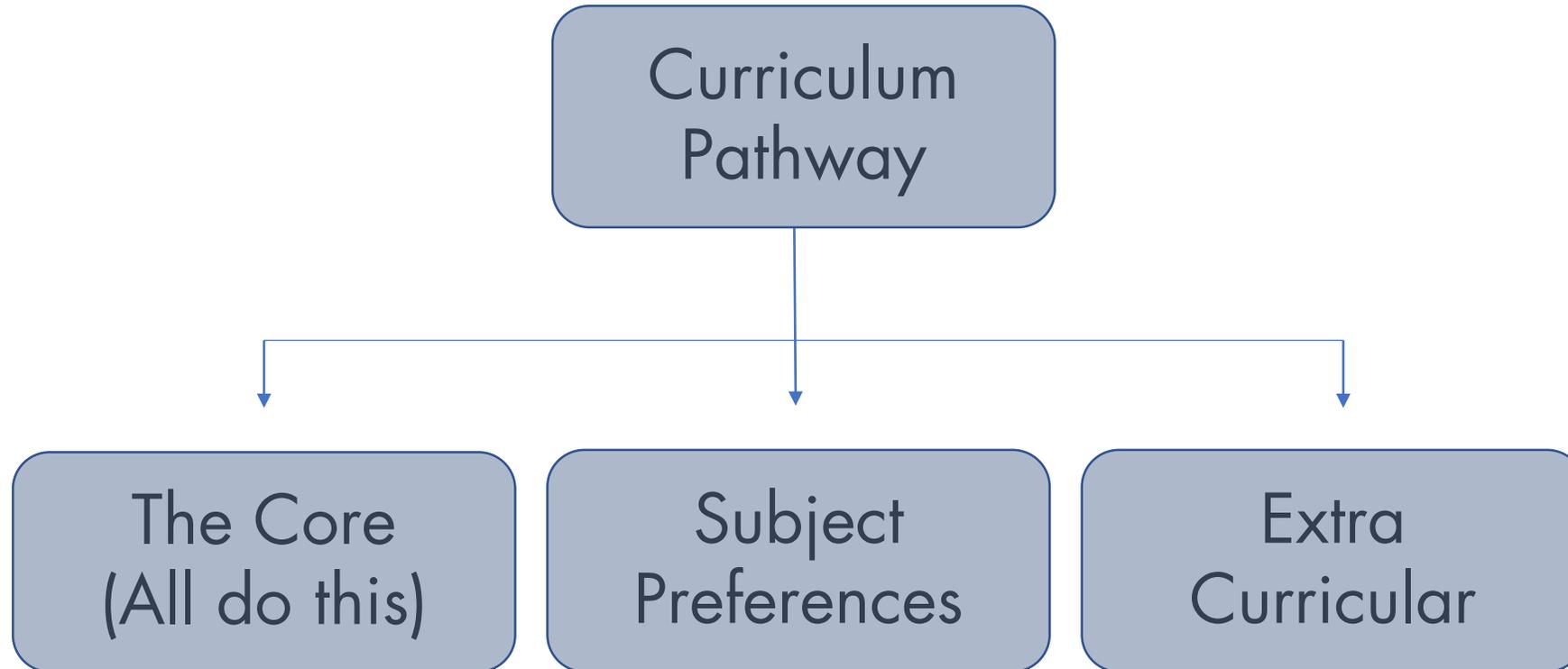

Which Pathway?

- Triple Science Pathway:

A pathway perfect for the most academic of students who have a love for science. For those students who already know that they would like to attend higher education and want to start preparing for their academic career early.

- Core Pathway:

A pathway perfect for those students who want the academic challenge of 8 GCSEs but also like to be active and want to embrace enrichment opportunities. The vast majority of our students will select this pathway.

- Vocational Pathways:

The perfect pathway for those students who want to throw themselves into the challenge of 7 GCSEs but also want to sample the world of work and learning opportunities outside of the classroom.



The Core Offer For All Students

- **English** (8 hours per fortnight) = 2 GCSEs; Language and Literature
- **Maths** (8 hours per fortnight) = 1 GCSE
- **Double Award Science** (10 hours per fortnight) = 2 GCSEs
or **Triple Science** (15hrs per fortnight) = 3 GCSEs
- **PE** (4 hours per fortnight)



Enrichment & Alternative Provision

Enrichment

- 1 hr additional English
- 1 hr additional Maths
- 2hrs additional Science
- 1 hr additional PE

Alternative Provision

- 4hrs of alternative provision
 - Construction (L1)
 - Creative Crafts (L2)
 - Working Skills for Life (E3)
 - Hair & Beauty (E3)
- 1 hr portfolio work



To meet the guidance from the Department for Education to ensure a 'broad and balanced' curriculum, students should choose at least one of the following subjects:

Triple Science, Computer Science, French, Geography, History or Spanish

Languages and reasons...

Whilst studying a Modern Foreign Language is not compulsory for students, we still encourage students to opt for one of these subjects.

Firstly, because any student wishing to go to university will need to follow a broad and balanced academic pathway, of which a language is an important part

Secondly, our languages department is brilliant!

We are also a 'Coubertin School' with the explicit aim of encouraging international cooperation, languages look great on a CV.

- In Year 10, we are pleased to offer an exciting opportunity for motivated students to undertake the Level 2 Higher Project Qualification (HPQ). This nationally recognised course offers you a chance to develop valuable academic and personal skills that can support your future education and career plans. Equivalent to 0.5 GCSE.
- In Year 11, we are excited to offer you a unique opportunity to take part in the Institute of Leadership and Management (ILM) Young Leaders Award — a nationally recognised qualification that will help you develop important life and leadership skills while also standing out on future applications.
- Both courses run after school, students apply via letter to attend courses. Further details will be sent out later in the year.

What is the role of the student?

- To take the process seriously
- To make good choices by understanding what decisions can be made
- **To appreciate that some preferences may not be possible due to numbers etc.**
- To use data from Reports, Parents Evenings and own experience
- Choose subjects that you enjoy
- To make the best decisions and not just go along with friends



Things to consider

- The majority of exams will be terminal (at the end of 2 years of study), only Hospitality & Catering, iMedia, Health & Social Care and Product Design will have controlled assessments.
- Ensure that you have a balanced approach to your choices
- For those aspiring to university, seriously consider choosing a humanities and a language as part of your program (not just about qualification, but wider education)
