

Year 9 Preferences 2026-8

A reminder that our year 9's are levelling up!

Don't forget to complete your pathway choice form before **3rd March**.

Below is an overview of the process and key information for families.

Students will choose their GCSE pathway: Triple Science, Core, or Vocational each offering a different balance of academic and practical learning.

All students study English Language & Literature, Maths, Science (Double or Triple), and PE.

Students then select additional subjects. To ensure a broad curriculum, they should pick at least one from: Triple Science, Computer Science, French, Spanish, Geography or History. Modern languages are encouraged as they support future study and career opportunities.

There are also opportunities for Enrichment, Alternative Provision (e.g., Construction, Creative Crafts, Hair & Beauty), and optional qualifications such as HPQ (Year 10) and the ILM Young Leaders Award (Year 11).

PSHE & Assembly Overview Spring Term - February to Easter

At William Brookes School, our PSHE curriculum this half term focuses on helping students develop healthy habits, positive relationships, and a strong understanding of themselves and others. Here's what each year group will be exploring...



PSHE LEARNING THIS HALF TERM

Year 7 – Understanding Puberty

Students will learn about the emotional and physical changes of puberty, menstrual wellbeing, changing relationships, and awareness of FGM.

Year 8 – Relationships & Gender Identity

This unit explores the difference between sex and gender, gender identity, sexism, feminism, masculinity, and the role of society and media in shaping our views.

Year 9 – Substance Awareness

Students will look at drug laws, the risks of smoking and vaping, alcohol awareness, and how peer pressure can influence decision-making.

Year 10 – External Influences

A focus on media, social media, family and cultural expectations, and how advertising affects the choices young people make.

Year 11 – Revision Skills

Practical revision strategies and guided time to help students prepare effectively for their upcoming exams.

ASSEMBLY THEMES

Across the term, assemblies will support whole-school values and encourage students to reflect, celebrate, and grow.

• Children's Mental Health Week

Exploring wellbeing, resilience, self-care, and how to seek help and support friends.

• International Women's Day


Celebrating women's achievements, challenging stereotypes, and showcasing inspiring female role models.

• Careers: "Who Do I Want to Be?"

Helping students reflect on their strengths and aspirations, and learn about different pathways including academic routes, apprenticeships, and entrepreneurship.


Health Campaign Presentations – Wednesday 25th February

Wednesday 5th March will see the exciting return of the Staff Dress-Up Competition! Let's see if we can beat last year's incredible costumes—challenge accepted!


