Year 9 Preferences 2026-8

A reminder that our year 9's are levelling up!

Don't forget to complete your pathway choice form before **3rd March**.

Below is an overview of the process and key information for families.

Students will choose their GCSE pathway: Triple Science, Core, or Vocational each offering a different balance of academic and practical learning.

All students study English Language & Literature, Maths, Science (Double or Triple), and PE.

Students then select additional subjects. To ensure a broad curriculum, they should pick at least one from: Triple Science, Computer Science, French, Spanish, Geography or History. Modern languages are encouraged as they support future study and career opportunities.

There are also opportunities for Enrichment, Alternative Provision (e.g., Construction, Creative Crafts, Hair & Beauty), and optional qualifications such as HPQ (Year 10) and the ILM Young Leaders Award (Year 11).

I had my first race of the 2026 season at clay pigeon, the M plate.

Practice day:

There was a two day practice and it was mostly dry on Friday and fully dry on Saturday. We were in the mix on pace lapping around the same times as everybody else, we were on a new tyre called the Vega which I am finding much better than the Dunlop we were on previously. The new tyre means we are needing to learn some things about how it affects the setup of the kart.



Heat 1:

Sunday was very wet and our strategy was to use old intermediates to save our wets. I started fifth and with the rest of the grid on new tyres I dropped down 7th, I also hadn't quite figured out the quickest line.

Heat 2:

This heat we started 11th we had new wets on this time and we had a good race finishing 5th.

Heat 3:

I started 5th for this one and I had a good start getting past two karts, I also managed to pick off one more to finish 2nd, I was on the pace of the leader now sometimes even a little bit quicker.



The Final!


The final:
